

## THE HEART OF THE HOUSE

The Joslyn Castle is a reflection of its owners. No coats of arms adorn the gates, and blank shields decorate the stonework. It is only at the heart of the house, the dining room, that center of family gatherings and formal entertainments, that we find some clue to the house's owners.



Sarah Joslyn spent \$10,000 on this room alone (the equivalent today of \$300,000). The quality of the woodwork carved by Edmunds Manufacturing of Chicago, one of the premier woodworking

firms in America, is nowhere more evident than in the overmantel frieze. In a rectangle delineated with egg and dart molding is a central fleur-de-lis in a beribboned cartouche with two scallop shells, the whole surrounded by scrolling acanthus leaves sprouting flowers, above a pair of affronted (facing) dolphins. A photo of this artwork has been chosen as a header throughout this issue.

For hundreds of years overmantels above the hearth – the traditional symbol of the home's warmth and hospitality - have featured coats of arms or emblems identifying a home's aristocratic owners. It is the symbolic program of the dining room overmantel that asserts who the Joslyns were and how they functioned in their world.

Its classical framework and motifs imply cultured homeowners familiar with the enlightened civilizations of Greece and Rome. The fleur-de-lis in the central cartouche is a direct reference to the French royal house and a supposed Joslyn connection through Gilbert Josselin who was born at the Chateau Josselin in Britany, but came over to England with



William the Conqueror to marry the daughter of a Saxon lord. The pair of fierce dolphins can be seen as a further reference to France; dolphins in conjunction with fleur-de-lis grace the shield of the royal heir – the dauphin – but to Joslyn intimates the dolphins were not some far-flung reference to Medieval royalty, but emblematic of George and Sarah themselves.

In the 21st century few people are familiar with the stories of Greece and Rome; yet once they were known even to small children. The Victorians adapted these classical tales; works such as those by the great Greek historian Herodotus were featured in all aspects of life from moralizing picture books to bright trade cards given away as premiums. Of all these tales none was more popular than that of Arion, a musician who, robbed by sailors and thrown into the sea, was saved by a dolphin. Though most people had never seen an actual dolphin they would have been taught that they were lovers of music ("Apollo's darlings," they accompanied the god of music), were sociable creatures fond of children and family, and for the service they did Arion and drowning sailors, were known as the "Philanthropists," creatures who saved souls in peril.

Joslyn claims to nobility may be tenuous, but few symbols could be more appropriate for George and Sarah with their passion for music, reputation for charity, and deep concern for society's vulnerable.

## BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS UPDATE

The changing season has brought a flurry of activity to the Castle grounds. As we prepare for the winter weather to come, several trees have been trimmed with the assistance of Phil Pierce, our consulting arborist and Terry Hughes Tree Service. In addition, some of the fruit trees planted last year are beginning to produce fruit. We have already enjoyed seeing apples and plums hanging proudly from the branches. We made the decision to remove some mature lilacs to help give them a fresh start come spring, and by our estimation close to 95 yards of mulch have been spread across the grounds this year.



Maintaining and caring for the grounds on this 5.57 acre estate is truly a labor of love for so many wonderful individuals. Guests to the Castle frequently comment on the stunning gardens. Even those of us on the staff, who see the grounds every day, marvel at the abundance of plants, flowers, and trees as they grow and transform. We also enjoy seeing the many furry and feathered friends that call the grounds home.

To further help us admire the beauty of the grounds, we are so excited to announce that a complete window washing – both inside and outside – has been completed on the Castle, Carriage House and Annex. Special thanks to Jason Shell of Tech Window & Pressure Cleaning for his attention to detail and friendly smile as he completed this large task.

The Annex / Castle Offices have been a focus for many projects, including the hanging of a new door on the west side exterior. New lights have been installed in the Annex basement and in the small

upstairs office space. In the Carriage House, plans are underway for some drywall and painting on the second floor.

Inside the Castle the storage area under the music room is close to being fully organized and painted. We are also close to finalizing the new signs that will be placed inside the Castle to aid our visitors and guests. We hope you will come see us this fall and winter at the Castle!

Docents focus on enhancing the visitor experience by leading interactive and engaging tours that share valuable information about the Castle and the Joslyns. Gina Primmer, Executive Director of the Castle, attests, "What I love most about our docents is how they are able to bring their individual interests, passions, and personalities to the Castle tours and our visitors. It's really special to watch them interact with guests, answering questions, and pointing out features of the home and grounds that mean the most to them."

## TOURS – THE “INS AND THE OUTS”

The Joslyn Castle tours are still going strong as people from near and far come to discover Omaha's Scottish Baronial Castle. Surrounded by small garden beds and nestled in between winding paths on 5.57 acres in the heart of midtown, the Joslyn Home is a gem to explore.

We are excited to announce that we have 'broken ground' on our new outside tour. This tour, designed to show you the historical significance of the gardens and grounds, encourages you to imagine for yourself what the Joslyns envisioned when building their home. From the Silverdale Limestone to the personalized front iron gates, the over 100 year old peonies to the arboretum of pines, and the footbridge to the Carriage house, there is so much to explore.

The Scottish baronial style incorporates aspects of a medieval tower house: crow-stepped gables, turrets, and crenellations. The estate's landscaping was arranged in an informal, yet lavish, style combining elements of picturesque and gardenesque landscape design. Our dedicated volunteer gardeners were recently awarded a Historic Preservation Commendation award by the Garden Club of America in recognition of their ongoing efforts to restore and maintain the landscape; showcasing the beautiful garden history and design of the Joslyn Castle grounds. Our outside tour will be introduced to the public in 2016 and run from Memorial Day to Labor Day. We look forward to adding this tour to our schedules.

Our inside tours continue to be a popular stop for groups of all ages and sizes. Senior citizen bank groups, marketing their tours as "Nine Countries Without a Passport," feature the Castle as the Scotland Tour

stop. These tours almost always request a presentation by the Scottish Society of Nebraska. In addition, our Violet's World tours, geared toward our younger guests, provide insight into life in the 1900s from a child's perspective. Of course these tours, along with our regular Castle tours, focus on the Castle and its rare materials and how they reflect a level of superb masonry, wood carving, stained glass, and mosaic tilework.

The first and third Sundays of the month continue to draw great crowds, with tours offered at 1 p.m., 2 p.m., and 3 p.m. No advanced reservations required. Private tours are still offered during the week, by appointment only, for those who cannot join us on the weekend. Be sure to plan a visit during November and December when the Castle is beautifully decorated for the holidays. Nothing will bring you into the holiday season more than the historic Joslyn Castle at Christmas time. Prices for our tours are \$10.00 for Adults and \$8.00 for Seniors, Students, and Military. Children under five are free. We hope to see you soon!




## THE 2015 LITERARY FESTIVAL: DICKENS AT THE CASTLE

Now celebrating its fifth year, the Joslyn Castle Literary Festival returns this fall celebrating the life and work of beloved Victorian author, Charles Dickens. Dickens was selected to be this year's featured author after learning that 2015 marks a significant milestone for the Omaha Community Playhouse. This year is their 90th Anniversary and their 40th year of performing A Christmas Carol. Dickens at the Castle will run from November 14 – 18 and December 12 – 13, 2015.

Sarah Joslyn was one of the Playhouse's earliest supporters, having gifted the land upon which the very first Playhouse was built. In addition, the Castle was the host site for the Omaha Community Playhouse's 90th Anniversary Celebration.

The festival will kick off with a fantastic evening in partnership with the Playhouse. On November 14, guests will have an opportunity to attend a drama performance featuring a one-man telling of A Christmas Carol

by John Hardy. During this stunning act, Hardy will transform into more than 40 different characters. The evening will also feature a panel discussion with representatives from the Omaha Community Playhouse, Susie Collins and Jerry Longe, as well as John Hardy and Jill Anderson. Your ticket price to the November 14 Drama Performance and lecture also includes a ticket to the December 6 A Christmas Carol performance at the Omaha Community Playhouse.



In mid-December, the literary festival will end with a festive and engaging musical performance, "Carols at the Castle," featuring Jill Anderson and Hal France.
